AUDIOLOGIST ADVISOR

The Audiologist Advisor will be responsible for administering and interpreting diagnostic audiology tests including auditory evoked potentials (AEP); providing advice and guidance on diagnostic and aural rehabilitation matters, developing informational booklets on hearing loss and rehabilitation, providing expert opinion on occupational hearing loss and tinnitus claims, and other related duties.

As a qualified candidate, you're able to:

- Independently plan and implement work schedules and prioritize duties in response to changing departmental and organizational demands
- Provide direction, advice, and feedback to co-workers, clients, and service providers on a variety of technical and procedural activities
- Clearly present and explain technical information/results, verbally and in writing, to individuals and groups, with varying levels of understanding and hearing ability
- Establish and maintain effective working relationships with co-workers and external individuals and groups
- Gather and provide appropriate information while being sensitive to client needs, using effective listening, probing and counseling techniques
- Collect, analyze and evaluate information in order to form diagnoses, provide recommendations and make reasoned decisions
- Travel possibly more than seven days per year

- Masters Degree in Audiology
- Certification in the Canadian Association of Speech-Language Pathologists and Audiologists and provincial registration
- Specialist knowledge of auditory physiology and pathology and their implications for communication
- Specialist knowledge of audiology diagnostic test battery in adults

- Ability to use auditory evoked potentials, otoacoustic emissions, and central auditory processing evaluation
- Knowledge of current hearing-aid technology, fitting protocols, and verification measures
- Ability to select, fit, evaluate, and verify current hearing-aid technology
- Knowledge of indicators of functional hearing loss, and the techniques use to identify and overcome it during audiologic evaluations
- A minimum of two years of directly related experience
- The ability to work in a computerized environment, preferably using Microsoft products
