CLINICAL SPECIALIST - OT

Clinical Specialist – OT acts as a clinical resource as a senior member of an interdisciplinary case management team. Duties include conducting research complementary to clinical work, participating actively in program development and educational opportunities and providing leadership and supervision of multiple treatment plans and providers, and liaising with and supervising external providers by undertaking reviews of workers' specific programs to ensure quality service is being provided to injured workers.

As a qualified candidate, you're able to:

- Apply theoretical knowledge to the assessment, interpretation, planning and implementation of active treatment programs for injured workers within current accepted practice guidelines
- Independently and as part of an interdisciplinary team, prioritize, plan and organize a challenging and variable work load
- Educate, consult, and motivate others and act as a resource to co-workers and others
- Build and maintain trusting and cooperative working relationships with a variety of individuals and organizations in an environment that is often adversarial
- Conduct onsite visits to injured works, worksites, and external service providers of clinical programs in order to review Board-funded services being provided for injured workers
- Travel throughout the region and stay overnight

You possess the following qualifications:

- Full registration and current membership in good standing with the College of Occupational Therapy of BC
- A minimum of six years of clinical experience
- The ability to work in a computerized environment, preferably using Microsoft products
- A valid driver's license
