RESEARCH ANALYST – POLICY AND RESEARCH

Focus areas of expertise will include: prevention/regulation review, assessments, rehabilitation, compensation, impact analysis, occupational disease and LTD.

- Liaise with WorkSafeBC officers and management, as well as relevant staff in other jurisdictions, agencies, and organizations
- Prepare detailed reports and summary documents suitable for both technical and lay readers
- Assist with the preparation of discussion papers, briefing notes and other materials related to specific focus areas of expertise
- Assist in public consultation process concerning the focus area of expertise
- Identify, research, and communicate trends and emerging issues relevant to the focus area

You possess the following experience and educational background:

- A university degree in a health science discipline, economics, finance, business, public administration, occupational hygiene, or a similar subject
- A minimum of two (2) years' experience researching, analyzing and evaluating complex information on a wide variety of issues
- A working knowledge of statistics and statistical analysis
- A working knowledge of the *Workers Compensation Act* or *Occupational Health and Safety Regulation* is preferred
