## OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY OFFICER — CONSTRUCTION

As an Occupational Safety Officer (OSO), you will inspect worksites to ensure compliance with various safety and accident-prevention regulations and practices. In addition, you will conduct research, participate in seminars, consult on accident prevention, and advise employers, workers and the public at large on matters related to health and safety.

You are currently a journeyed tradesperson, foreman, lead hand or superintendent in the construction industry, who has demonstrated leadership in workplace health and safety.

### As a qualified candidate, you're able to:

- Conduct worksite inspections and/or identify hazards within the construction industry and direct corrective safety measures
- Make and enforce timely decisions independently using sound judgment and knowledge, and deal effectively with emergencies as necessary

### You possess:

- 5 years' directly related industry experience
- A diploma in Health and Safety is preferred, however, equivalency will be considered
- A professional designation from the Board of Canadian Registered Safety Professionals is preferred

**Balance and wellness.** As a leader in promoting healthy and safe workplaces, WorkSafeBC believes the health and wellness of our employees depends on a solid work-life balance. As a member of our staff, you'll have access to services that can help you get the most out of work . . . and life.

- **Care and nurturing:** Take leave in one or more periods to a maximum of five years for the care and nurturing of your children.
