## Achievement Recognition Awards Program

### RECOGNIZING EXCELLENCE, PROFESSIONALISM AND EXPERTISE IN OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY

The Canadian Society of Safety Engineering (CSSE) is a non-profit organization of safety practitioners. Our objective is to promote the arts and sciences of loss prevention for the conservation of people, equipment, material and the environment, and to encourage the pursuit of excellence in the profession.

Now in its 22<sup>nd</sup> year, the BC Yukon Region of the CSSE has recognized outstanding achievement by both individuals and organizations through the annual Achievement Recognition Awards program. Each year, after nominations are received, an awards committee selects the winners.

#### BC CSSE Awards – as easy as 1, 2, 3...

1. Choose the Award Category you wish to enter.
2. Nominate yourself, a colleague or company/organization.
3. Send in a completed Nomination Form by the deadline date.

#### Individual Awards:

Nominations are accepted for individuals who have demonstrated exceptional leadership in the profession which resulted in a significant contribution to the workplace. You may nominate yourself or someone else in one of three categories:

*Senior Safety Professional* — CSSE member with more than 5 years safety experience

*Novice Safety Professional* — CSSE member with less than 5 years safety experience

*Non-CSSE Safety Professional* — safety professional who is not a CSSE member

#### Organization Awards:

Nominations are accepted for organizations, unions, teams, etc., who have succeeded in making a significant contribution in the workplace. You may nominate your own organization or group, or one that you are familiar with, in one of four categories:

*1-50 employees or members*

*51-500 employees or members*

*500+ employees or members*

*Safety Specific Non-Profit Organizations*

#### Special Awards:

*Construction Industry — Safety Innovation Award* — to recognize organizations, unions, teams, etc., who have succeeded in completing an innovation/special project in the Construction

Sector in relation to health and safety that benefits workers beyond their workplace. This award is sponsored by WorkSafeBC.

*Food Processing Industry — Safety Innovation Award* — to recognize organizations, unions, teams, etc., who have succeeded in completing an innovation/special project in the Food Processing Industry in relation to health and safety that benefits workers beyond their workplace. Sponsored by the Food Industry Occupational Safety Association of B.C.

*Mar Sherwood Bursary (for students enrolled in full time studies of OH&S)* — this bursary will be given in recognition of academic achievement, participation in the CSSE and the overall need of the student

*Outstanding Achievement by a Safety Professional* — to recognize an outstanding achievement in the area of development of a safety tool, device or equipment, writing of a safety text, program or training course, or production of a safety video, computer program or similar audio-visual element

*Robert Wright Lifetime Achievement* — to recognize the lifetime achievements of a CSSE member with 20 years or more experience, based on their participation in CSSE and their overall contribution to the field of safety through participation, contribution and/or mentoring

*Special Projects (2 or more people)* — to recognize a project that will enhance occupational health & safety beyond the workplace

**TruckSafe Excellence Award** — to recognize an individual who, by his/her commitment to truck/workplace safety and leadership has made an outstanding contribution to the promotion of workplace safety in the trucking industry. Sponsored by WorkSafeBC

**TruckSafe Organizational Excellence Award** — to recognize a company, industry or labour organization/association, which by its commitment to truck/workplace safety, vision and leadership has made an outstanding contribution to the promotion of workplace safety in the trucking industry. Sponsored by WorkSafeBC

**Young and New Workers — Best Training/Orientation Program** — to recognize an organization for their outstanding program tailored to meet the specific needs of young workers (ages 15-24) — sponsored by WorkSafeBC. There are two categories of awards for organizations with:

*1-19 employees (small business)  
20 or more employees*

**Young and New Workers — Special Project** — to recognize an organization, union, team, etc. — for their innovative project(s) in relation to young and new worker injury prevention. Sponsored by WorkSafeBC
