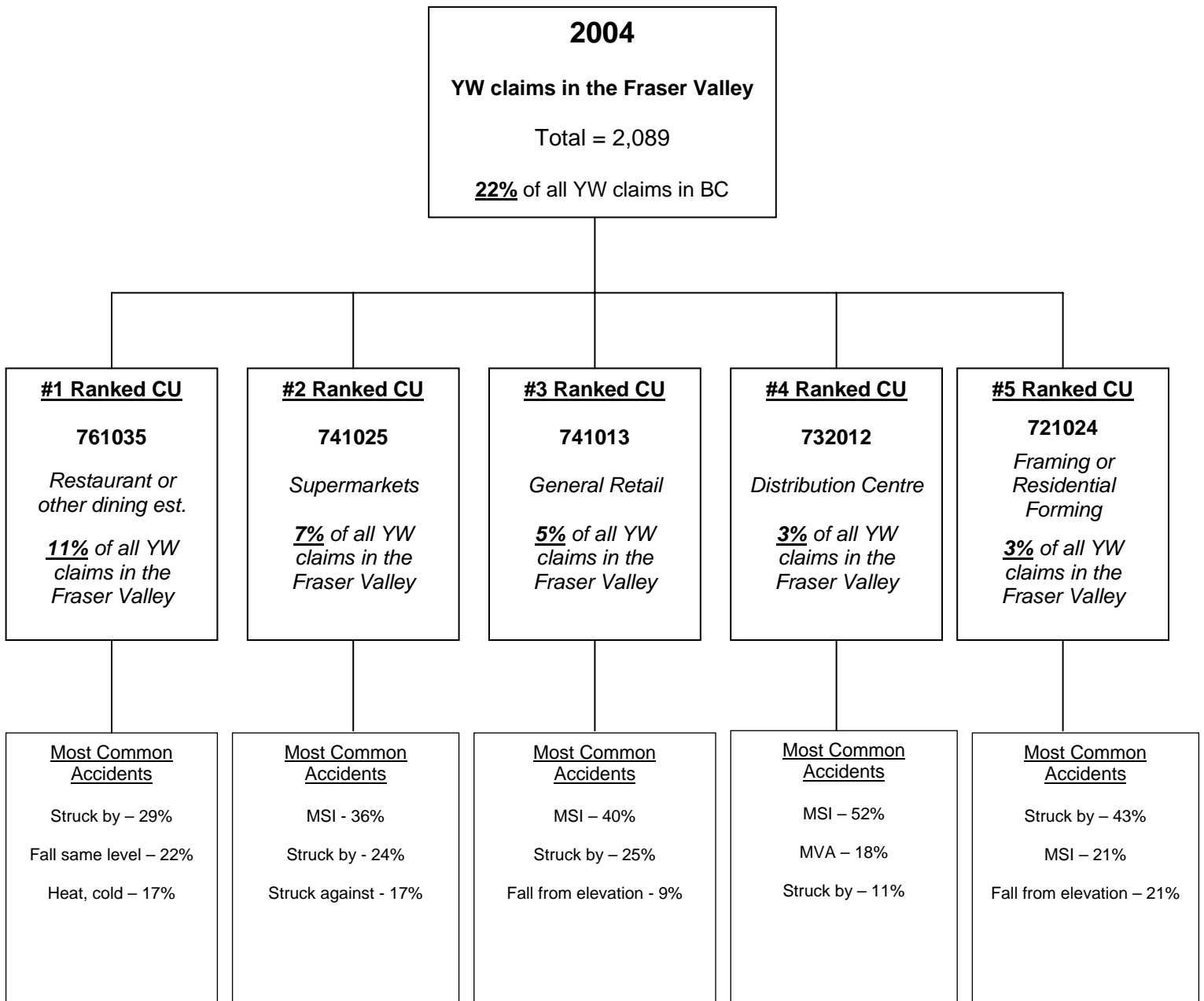


Fraser Valley

Fraser Valley Young Worker Facts

Young Worker (Age 15-24) Accepted Claims in the Fraser Valley

• Number of young worker accepted claims for injuries in 2004	2,089
• Number of young worker accepted claims for injuries in 2000	2,442
• Percentage <i>decrease</i> between 2000 and 2004	17%
• Percentage of all young worker accepted claims in BC in 2004	22%
• Number of young workers injured every week in the Fraser Valley	40/week

Male Young Workers in the Fraser Valley

• Number of male young worker accepted claims for injuries in 2004	1,630
• Percentage of all young worker accepted claims in the Fraser Valley in 2004	78%

Female Young Workers in the Fraser Valley

• Number of female young worker accepted claims for injuries in 2004	459
• Percentage of all young worker accepted claims in the Fraser Valley in 2004	22%

Cost of Young Worker (Age 15-24) Accepted Claims in the Fraser Valley

• Cost of young worker accepted claims for injuries 2000-2004	\$31million
• Cost of young worker accepted claims every week between 2000-2004	\$120,000/week

In BC the Most Common Injury Types for Young Worker Accepted Claims, 2000-2004

1. Sprains, strains, tears	42%
2. Cuts, lacerations	15%
3. Bruises, contusions	11%

In BC the Most Common Accident Types for Young Worker Accepted Claims, 2004

1. Struck by an object	27%
2. Overexertion/repetitive movement	25%
3. Struck against an object	9%

Provincial Young Worker Injury Rate, 2004

• 2004 workplace injury rate for workers aged 15 to 24	3.5
• 2004 provincial workplace injury rate for all workers	3.1
• 2004 young male workplace injury rate	5.4
• 2004 young female workplace injury rate	1.7
