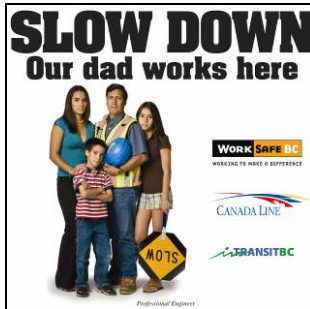


Canada Line Sign Locations

"Motorists seem to forget that flaggers are just there to help make a safe worksite for them and our crews. What would happen if we [traffic control people] weren't there to assist them?"



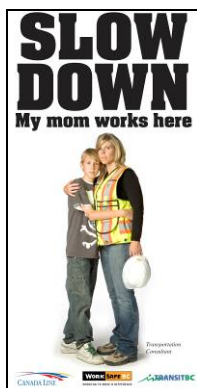
Carleen Fraser, Traffic Control Person

"TCPs are just people doing their jobs. Our families want us to come home at the end of the day too."



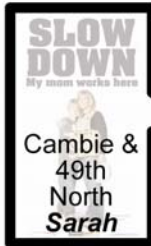
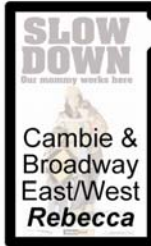
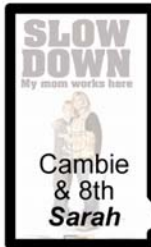
