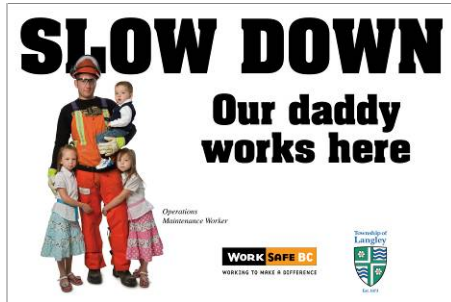


“Slow Down” Campaign: City of Pitt Meadows and Township of Langley

With children Carson (19 months), Katie (5), and Karly (5)

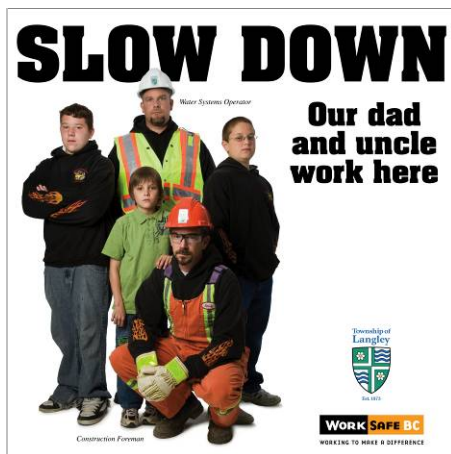
Ryan was working in a closed lane when a driver crashed into a traffic sign and some cones.

Gerald lost a co-worker as a result of a motorist's speed and inattention.

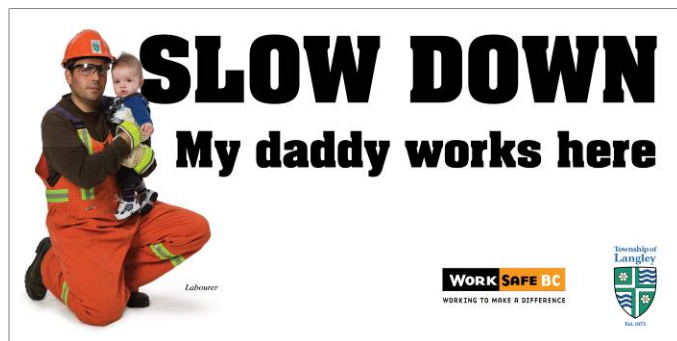


Randy Campagna (orange overalls)

Rick has witnessed a road worker being hit by a vehicle and believes that getting people to slow down is a daily challenge.



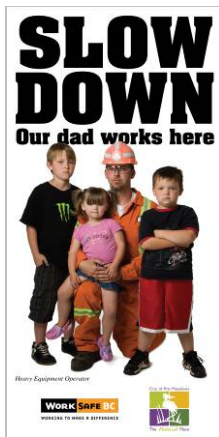
Jack C.

With children Jada (3), Keegan (6), and Evan (9)

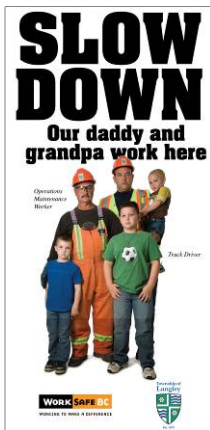
Maple Ridge resident Aaron was almost hit by an inexperienced driver.
