Your 2008 rate information package

By now, you should have received an information package that outlines your rate for 2008, your experience rating adjustment (if applicable), plus details about claims your firm may have incurred. If you opened your account after October 5, when we printed the packages, you probably received a letter outlining your 2007 and 2008 rates instead.

Amended working alone regulation

WorkSafeBC has amended the Occupational Health and Safety Regulation to improve health and safety for individuals working alone or in isolation. The amendments will require mandatory pre-payment at gas stations throughout the province and introduce new requirements to protect workers working alone.

The amendments formally acknowledge the potential for violence and injury facing individuals who work alone, particularly those in late-night retail establishments such as gas stations and convenience stores.

Door-to-door sales complaints

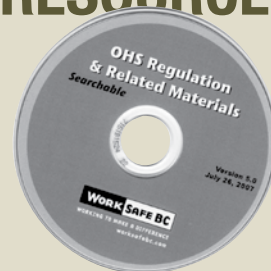
WorkSafeBC has received complaints from businesses that people are approaching them and pressuring them to buy safety posters to be in compliance with the Occupational Health and Safety Regulation. However, these sales are not authorized by WorkSafeBC, nor is it necessary to buy these items in order to comply.

For example, last summer, a manager of a Richmond-based retail store was approached by two young men claiming to sell posters that would help his business comply with WorkSafeBC regulations. The manager was skeptical, so he took a business card from the men, declined their offer, and immediately contacted WorkSafeBC.

If posters are necessary for compliance, they are available for free from WorkSafeBCstore.com.

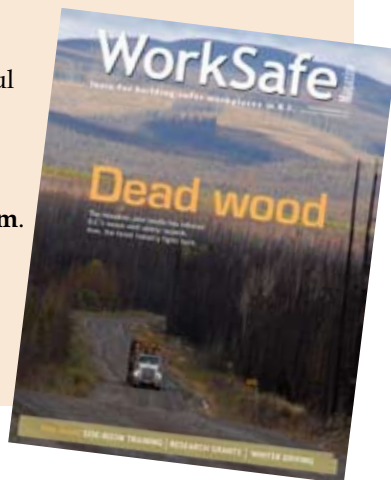
