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Annual report available online

WorkSafeBC has released its *2007 Annual Report and 2008–2010 Service Plan*. Highlights include:

- The employer premium rate decreased by 12.2 percent, to \$1.66 in 2007 from \$1.89 in 2006
- A lower provincial injury rate, in spite of strong employment growth
- The establishment of a Capital Adequacy Reserve, to protect the Accident Fund from market fluctuations
- Continued improvement in return-to-work outcomes

Claims-related forms are changing

If one of your employees has a work-related illness or injury, remember to go to **WorkSafeBC.com** promptly to report it. If you don't have Internet access, you can submit this information using the Employer's Report of Injury or Occupational Disease (Form 7) instead.

Other key forms, which initiate a claim, will be revised in the near future, including those to be completed by workers (Form 6), independent operators (Form 6/7), and owners or masters of fishing vessels (Form 7F).

Workplace status update

At its March 2008 meeting, the WorkSafeBC Board of Directors revised the effective date of a previously approved policy amendment package, to ensure that WorkSafeBC has adequate resources available to effectively introduce the changes for stakeholders.

Policy changes relating to workplace status in the *Assessment Manual* were approved by the Board of Directors in 2007, with an effective date of January 1, 2009. The Board of Directors has revised the effective date of the workplace status policy changes to January 1, 2010.

Quick automated phone service

We've introduced a new phone number to allow you to simply and easily report your payroll and pay your premiums. Simply phone 1 877 FilePay (1 877 345-3729).

To use the service, you'll need:

- The payroll report ID from the top right corner of your Employer's Remittance Form
- Your payroll figures
- Your credit card information, if you want to make a payment.

Most transactions can be completed in two minutes or less.

Note: You can't use this number to access all our automated phone services. To cancel your account or amend your payroll, for instance, you'll need to call 604 244-6181 or toll-free at 1 888 922-2768.

Teleclaim can serve in 170 languages

Injured workers who call WorkSafeBC's Teleclaim contact centre to file claims over the phone can now speak to our representatives in their language of choice through third-party interpretation in over 170 languages.

If a worker who has trouble with English calls Teleclaim and all our internal interpreters are unavailable, we'll connect with an external interpreter, who will join the conversation via conference call within 60 seconds. The interpreters don't record calls or keep any official records that could compromise workers' confidentiality.

The service was introduced in response to the growing portion of B.C.'s workforce that doesn't speak English as a primary language.
