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GoldStar Clearances coming

Often, firms obtain a clearance letter to prove they're registered with WorkSafeBC and paying regular premiums. Prime contractors frequently require clearances from subcontractors before hiring them, or they withhold final payments until the subcontractors have paid their WorkSafeBC premiums. This protects prime contractors from having to pay subcontractors' premiums should the subcontractors default.

This spring, WorkSafeBC will introduce GoldStar Clearances, giving qualifying firms advance clearance to the beginning of the next quarter. To qualify, firms must have had an active registration with WorkSafeBC for at least 24 of the last 36 months and be up-to-date on reporting payroll and paying premiums.

Streamlined online payroll processing

We've enhanced our electronic web service at WorkSafeBC to allow payroll service providers – firms that do payroll processing and other bulk electronic business transactions for multiple employers – to conveniently submit payroll reports and payments to us on behalf of their clients.

This enhancement streamlines bulk processing for payroll service providers, so that they can now offer their employer customers a more complete range of services, including the electronic submission of payments.

One provider – ADP Canada Employer Services – now offers this service; other payroll service providers are expected to follow.

Teleclaim update

Last October, WorkSafeBC introduced Teleclaim on Vancouver Island. Now, workers who are hurt on the job can simply call to report their injuries and start the claim process. Feedback from users has been overwhelmingly positive, but many workers still don't know about the service. If your firm operates on Vancouver Island, and one of your employees is injured at work, be sure to have him or her call Teleclaim at 1 888 WORKERS (1 888 967-5377).

Calculate your experience rating online

Now when you sign up for online services with us, you can take advantage of new experience rating calculators that automatically plug in basic information about your firm (your payroll, classification, and base rate, for instance) and help you more accurately predict how changing your payroll and claim costs will affect your experience rating – and, ultimately, the premiums you pay.

If you already have access to online services, log in to use the calculators. If you don't have access yet, here's how it works:

- Go to www.worksafebc.com/insurance.
- Under "Manage your account," click on "Calculate your experience rating discount or surcharge."
- Select the "SecureConnect" link and follow the instructions.

Are your claim costs correct?

If you receive Claim Cost Statements, please examine them to make sure claim costs are allocated correctly. Beginning July 1, 2007, WorkSafeBC will not adjust claim costs if more than 75 days have passed since the date of the allocation decision. Also, if you want the decision reviewed, you must file your request for review within 90 days of the decision date.
