Section #:Schedule 3-A Minimum Levels of First Aid (b) "there are areas in the workplace which an ambulance service cannot safely access, and for which workers at the workplace are required by this Regulation to be trained, equipped and capable of effecting rescue".

Comments: A site where a Level 2 is required will need a level 3 and an emergency transportation vehicle in case of the above. Pretty much every industrial site will have confined spaces, some have multiple storied structures where people work, and many places have rescue folks trained for rescuing from confined spaces and elevated work areas. What does "accessible by ambulance mean" and when exactly does a worksite require workers to be trained in rescue? Does this mean that these place now required a Level 3 and emergency transportation vehicle?
