- (3) The 2011 National Occupational Classification (NOC) standard has been in use since 2013 for injuries occurred in 2013 or later, while the 1991 Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) standard was used for injuries occurred in 2012 or before. The mapping between the two sets of data is primarily achieved through using a concordance table developed by the Statistical Services group of WorkSafeBC. However, despite the careful construction of the concordance table, discontinuities arising from coding changes between the two classifications can lead to significant changes in trends.
- (4) There was a general decrease in claims reported to WorkSafeBC in 2020 owing to the pandemic.
- (5) Due to coding updates, some numbers in this table may differ slightly from the corresponding ones reported previously.
