(1) Claim counts are by year of injury, and include all claims for injury years 2009 through 2018 that were accepted for short-term disability, long-term disability, or work-related death benefits either in the year of injury or in the following year (until October 31, 2019 for 2018 injuries). Health-care-only claims are not included.

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- (2) Uncoded claims have been proportionately allocated and the allocated counts have been rounded to whole numbers. As column and row totals have been rounded independently, the columns and rows may not add up exactly to the totals shown. There might also be a slight difference in the total of a group between this table and other tables.
- (3) The figures for 2009 to 2011 have been impacted by a drop in the number of reported injuries (due in part to the economic downturn) and business process changes.
- (4) The 2011 National Occupational Classification (NOC) standard has been in use since 2013 for injuries occurred in 2013 or later, while the 1991 Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) standard was used for injuries occurred in 2012 or before. The mapping between the two sets of data is primarily achieved through using a concordance table developed by the Statistical Services group of WorkSafeBC. However, despite the careful construction of the concordance table, discontinuities arising from coding changes between the two classifications can lead to significant changes in trends.
