- (2) Uncoded claims have been allocated and the allocated counts have been rounded to whole numbers. As column and row totals have been rounded independently, the columns and rows may not add up exactly to the totals shown.
- (3) The 2011 National Occupational Classification (NOC) standard has been in use since 2013 for injuries occurred in 2013 or later, while the 1991 Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) standard was used for injuries occurred in 2012 or before. The mapping between the two sets of data is primarily achieved through using a concordance table developed by the Statistical Services group of WorkSafeBC. However, despite the careful construction of the concordance table, discontinuities
